

TIPS FOR PUTTING HYPERSTUDIO PRESENTATIONS ON THE WEB

1. Pages requiring plugins should be tested on Internet Explorer as well as other browsers which accept plugins and also on Windows as well as Mac systems.
2. Some of the essential information could be conveyed by creating a sequence of .gifs to represent the stack (from screen shots), to help any visitors for whom a plugin is not an option.
3. Most users will not normally have all the latest plugins installed so we should offer an “instructions page” for users who might need help getting the plugin installed and working. Here is a suggested set of instructions:

- *Make sure your browser and platform are on this list of supported ones..
- *Bookmark this page (so that it will be easy to return).
- *Link to the spot on www.hyperstudio.com for the download, different one for each major platform
- *Explanation about installing downloaded file into Netscape plugins folder
- *Quit Netscape and then restart it
- *Then select the bookmark made in #1
- *Now click on the link to open the stack

HYPERSTUDIO MIME TYPE

For a HyperStudio stack to work on the web the server needs to be set up for it.

TO WEBMASTERS: Adding the mime type is done by

1. stopping the web server (https) process
2. editing the mime types configuration file on unix, to add a line, and then
3. restarting the https process.

Specifically:

Add this line:

Type+application/hstu exts=stk

To this file:

/usr/local/netscape/nse-home/https-central/config/mim.types
